What started as a single school in Siem Reap has grown into a network of 21 schools, educating over *8,000 students* yearly and aiming to brighten countless more futures.

CFC ensures that every child has access to education and nourishment, while comprehensive *teacher training & youth programming* drives educational change nationwide.







Our Approach to Teaching and Learning

Caring for Cambodia is defining and guiding 21st-century education in Cambodia. As a collaborator, trainer, and resource for educators, administrators, community leaders, and youth, CFC provides new, diverse, and expanded concepts and methodologies to inspire learning through a new lens. CFC brings an understanding of leadership, innovation, community, and development to programming and humancapacity-building, allowing learners to experience what it means to be educational competent and ready for Cambodia's next wave of economic growth.

Caring for Cambodia holistically with schools and the Ministry of Education to deeply integrate into the teaching, learning, and school culture throughout the Siem Reap province. Our approach is based on the belief that students learn best when they feel a sense of health and wellness, connection and belonging to those around them, are engaged in skill-based learning, and are empowered to take action to seek out further opportunities and experiences.

The world is evolving faster than ever before, and educators need the resources to help our systems of learning change along with it. Through our partnerships, CFC helps teachers, administrators, and ministry and community leaders integrate new learning methods into all areas of this community.

Unique Comprehensive School Partnership Model for Cambodia in 2024

CFC has developed a unique developmental model of teacher training that has proven successful in the implementation of child-centered, independent learning strategies in all of our classrooms from preschool through high school.

CFC's Developmental Teacher Training Model is in sharp contrast to the large "seminar" approach to teacher training that MoEYS is obliged to deliver due to budget constraints and pressure to reach maximum numbers of teachers. While well intended, our teachers describe these large seminars as "ineffective." Observations by CFC teacher trainers confirm that prior to their intervention, there was virtually no evidence of child-centered learning strategies effectively in practice in our classrooms as a result of these MoEYS workshops.

CFC's Developmental Teacher Training Model provides Cambodian teachers a consistent, gradual, four-step process for implementing new teaching strategies. These strategies are based on current international "best practice" in primary education, and are in line with goals set forth in the MoEYS curriculum.

Four-Step Teacher Training Framework

Step 1: Theory Workshop

MoEYS contract teachers receive a theoretical introduction to carefully defined teaching strategies in their mother tongue, through an interpreter. This introduction provides practical information in "how" to implement child-centered, independent teaching strategies, and "why" these strategies support child-centered, independent learning pedagogy. The primary goal of Step 1 is to support the MoEYS teachers in thinking beyond their current, rote "chalk and talk" practice.

Step 2: Demonstrating to MoEYS Teachers

A hands-on session for the MoEYS contract teachers where CFC teacher trainers demonstrate in the classroom environment the theory presented in Step 1. MoEYS contract teachers are asked to place themselves in the role of students, as CFC trainers instruct. Experimentation with newly introduced materials and resources is critical to this second stage of the training model. All written materials are translated into Khmer and presented in a written manual format.

Step 3: CFC Trainers Teaching Students

CFC Trainers teach a class of Cambodian students with the support of a translator. The MoEYS contract teachers observe the instruction. They are encouraged to reflect on the theory provided in Step 1, while observing "best practice" during the demonstration lesson. Teacher questions based on their observations are a vital part of the model; they also allow the trainers to assess the MoEYS contract teachers' new understandings.

Step 4: MoEYS Teachers Teach

Finally, the MoEYS contract teachers are asked to teach their own classes using the demonstration lesson. The Trainers use a team approach and provide support. Once again at the end of the session, the Trainer debriefs with the teachers to ensure they understand the teaching process demonstrated.

Provided an International Teacher Training project in collaboration with practicing teachers from partner schools in Singapore. The project introduced a "Developmental" Teacher Training method for contract teachers which has been endorsed by the Provincial department of education of MoEYS.

Teacher Training in Action

Primary school

- Prepare classrooms, equip them with sufficient equipment and teaching materials to make the classroom environment conducive for students.
- Implement a curriculum to help slow learners in primary education at all levels to further strengthen the quality of education, reduce repeater rate and dropout rate.
- Provide librarians and equipment to effectively use library resources in accordance with the standards of the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports.
- Provide educational materials such as: books, pens, pencils, school uniforms, shoes, bags and bicycles, etc., to the most need students who are experiencing difficulties and students who have passed the 6th grade exam

Secondary school

- Providing STEM to Aranh Sakor CFC High school and Bakong High school.
- Establishing Career fair events once/year at Aranh Sakor CFC High school and Bakong Hunsen High school and other secondary schools.
- Providing ICT training and curriculum instruction to teachers at MOEYS.
- Scholarships for universities

Reflection & Evaluation of Teacher Training Progress

The impact of this program has been significant. The quality of education has increased steadily compared to other schools, which can be guaranteed to allow strong independence and ownership over all aspects of the schools, both effectively and efficiently. In this Comprehensive School Teaching Model, staff and teachers perform duties as assigned by the director or their superiors. Teachers are competent, have good teaching skills, have a good work ethic and internal solidarity, and have high professional ethics.

As a result of CFC and mentor teachers, target school management teams have been ranked as good principals, and target schools have been recognized as model public service units in the education sector, ranked in the past year, based on nationwide evaluations and through the evaluation of the Inter-Ministerial Technical Committee of the (ICTC) based on the evaluation criteria of 8 standards

- Public service standards;
- Standards or regulations for the provision of public services by the organization;
- Public financial management in the organization;
- Human resource management and development in the organization;
- Organization and improvement of the organization's environment;
- Good relations with citizens, communities and development partners, as well as participation in evaluations by users of public services;
- Solving challenges with citizens and communities; and
- Initiating new ideas and innovations.

Based on the criteria above, Caring for Cambodia supported schools have achieved the goals according to the policy set out by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports of the Kingdom of Cambodia. These schools have been endorsed as schools are on the progress of many achievements that are strong, self-reliant and highly responsible in ensuring sustainability in both quantity and quality where the school leadership has the ability to lead teachers and develop the school.

As a result of this achievement, during the school year 2024, CFC is now able to hand over the ESL, ICT and health programs, responsibility for paying for electricity, teacher training and school curriculum development. This is a significant milestone reached in the goal to support foundational growth in our community.

CFC English Language Support (ELS) Program: Empowering Through Language in 2024

In 2024, Caring for Cambodia's English Language Support (ELS) Program continues to make significant strides in enhancing English proficiency and fostering a love for language learning among our students. Our initiatives focus on innovative teaching methods, technology integration, and promoting a culture of reading.

Program Leadership and Curriculum Progress

- **1.** Miss Lav Pov promoted to ESL Program Manager on April 29, 2024, bringing fresh perspectives to the program
- 2. All ESL classes (Pilot 1, 2, and 3) successfully completed Unit 5 of the curriculum
- **3.**Timely completion of student attendance and scoring for April and May across all ESL classes **4.**Conducted 6 weekly meetings focusing on:
 - Classroom updates
 - Teaching demonstrations
 - Technology integration strategies
- 5. Performed 9 class observations, including:
 - Inventory checks
 - Story book tracking
- 6. Mrs. Kimchoeurn recreated materials for Unit 5, Pilot 2 for all classes
 - Addressed issues with outdated or lost resources
 - Ensured consistency and quality across all ESL classes

Technology Integration in Language Learning

1.Smart Devices in Classrooms:

- Consistent use of tablets and smart TVs in ESL classes
- Teacher feedback: "Using smart TV and tablets for learning and teaching is very helpful and important. They can provide the lesson to students fast and fun."
- 2. Educational Apps:
 - Three new applications installed on tablets in each school:ABC 123
 - These apps enhance interactive learning and cognitive skills development

 - Notable improvement in students' technological proficiency

Promoting Reading Culture

- Increased participation in the story book borrowing program
- Students show high interest in taking books home, reporting that "story books help them to relax and enjoy"
- Observed correlation between reading habits and language skill improvement

- Significant improvement in listening and speaking reading writing skill across all levels
- Increased engagement with technology-aided learning

- **5. English for Specific Purposes (ESP) Courses:** Developing specialized English courses for older students, focusing on business, technology, and academic English.

- **7.English Language Podcasting Club:** Creating a student-run English language podcast to enhance speaking skills and build confidence.

CFC Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Program: Advancing Digital Literacy in 2024

In 2024, Caring for Cambodia's ICT Program continues to make significant strides in enhancing digital literacy and technological infrastructure across our supported schools. Our initiatives focus on providing cutting-edge resources, expanding internet connectivity, and offering advanced coding education to prepare students for the digital future.

SabaiCode Advanced Programming Initiative

- 10 students successfully completed Level 3 of the SabaiCode program
- These students have now progressed to Level 5, demonstrating remarkable growth in coding skills
- Group 3 presented their final projects for Level 4, showcasing innovative applications of their programming knowledge

Infrastructure Enhancements

1.Equipment Upgrades:

- Procured 2 new computers for the ESL team (May 21, 2024)Beneficiaries: Lav Pov (ESL Program Manager) and Khy Kimchouern (ESL Assistant)

CFC Maintenance Program: Building a Better Learning Environment in 2024

In 2024, Caring for Cambodia's Maintenance Program continues to play a crucial role in ensuring our schools provide safe, functional, and inspiring spaces for learning. Our initiatives focus on infrastructure improvements, sustainable practices, and collaborative efforts with school administration to maintain and enhance educational facilities.

Comprehensive Infrastructure Upgrades

Throughout 2024, we've undertaken significant repairs and improvements across CFC target schools, addressing both immediate needs and long-term sustainability:

- 1. Cafeteria Enhancements:
 - Constructed new tables for cafeterias at:Bakong Primary School
 - Improved dining experience and capacity for students
- 2. Sanitation Facilities Upgrade:
 - Renovated two toilet rooms at Aranh High School
 - Enhanced hygiene standards and accessibility
- **3.**Hygiene Promotion:
 - Removed outdated and installed a new hand-washing station at Aranh Primary School
 - Supports ongoing health and hygiene education efforts
- **4.** Facility Expansion:
 - Extended roof near the Outreach room at Aranh High School
 - Created a sheltered area for students to store school supplies

Collaborative Maintenance Initiatives

We've strengthened our partnership with school principals to ensure ongoing care of school environments:

- Conducted workshops on sustainable facility management
- Implemented a shared responsibility model for daily maintenance
- Developed long-term maintenance schedules tailored to each school's needs

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Sustainable Practices Implementation

- Introduced eco-friendly materials in repairs where possible
- Installed energy-efficient lighting systems in renovated areas

CFC WASH Program: Enhancing Health and Hygiene in Schools for 2024

In 2024, Caring for Cambodia's Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) Program continues to make significant strides in improving the health and well-being of students across our target schools. Our initiatives focus on infrastructure improvements, community engagement, and fostering a culture of hygiene among students and staff.

Comprehensive WASH Facility Upgrades

Throughout 2024, we've undertaken substantial improvements to WASH facilities across CFC target schools:

1.Water Filtration Systems:

- Replaced mini filters at all CFC target schools
- Changed post-support filters for all filtration systems
- These upgrades ensure continued access to clean, safe drinking water for students
- 2. Strategic Facility Relocation:
 - Moved the water pump at Aranh Primary School from a contaminated area to a clean zone
 - This relocation significantly reduces the risk of water contamination
- 3. Regular Maintenance:
 - Implemented a systematic cleaning schedule for handwashing stations and water filter areas
 - Engaged school principals in taking ownership of WASH facility care

Water Quality Assurance

In line with our commitment to student health, we've implemented a rigorous water testing protocol:

- Conducted comprehensive water quality tests at all CFC schools
- Tests include checks for bacterial contamination, pH levels, chlorine content, nitrate levels, and turbidity
- Monthly testing schedule established, with WASH team and school staff responsible for ongoing monitoring



Community Engagement and Education

We've expanded our WASH education initiatives:

- **1.**WASH Event Celebrations:
 - Hosted a major WASH event at Preas Theat Primary School 549 attendees
 - Event featured interactive demonstrations on proper handwashing techniques, water conservation, and sanitation practices
- 2. School Principal Engagement:
 - Conducted workshops with school principals on WASH facility management
 - Developed collaborative action plans for maintaining WASH infrastructure

Student WASH Ambassador Program

Launched a new initiative to involve students in WASH promotion:

- Trained select students as WASH Ambassadors 149 students

Guest Speaker Series: Inspiring Young Writers

We recently hosted Mr. Tim Many, a renowned author, at Bakong High School. This event was part of our ongoing effort to:

- Expose students to professional writing techniques
- Inspire creativity and self-expression through literature
- Encourage participation in writing competitions and publications

Impact: 35 students at Bakong High School have enhanced their writing skills, with many now crafting original poems for potential publication.

CFC Gender Equity and Empowerment (GEE) Program: Advancing Equality in 2024

In 2024, Caring for Cambodia's Gender Equity and Empowerment (GEE) program continues to make significant strides in promoting equality and empowering students across our supported schools. Our initiatives focus on education, community engagement, and creating supportive environments for all genders.

Comprehensive Gender Education Assessment

We conducted a pre-test in early 2024 to gauge students' understanding of gender issues before implementing our enhanced curriculum:

Participation and Results:

- Total participants: 1,356 (59% female)
- Overall pass rate: 60%

Breakdown by Grade:

- Grade 7: 394 tested (53% female), 57% passed
- Grade 8: 265 tested (55% female), 67% passed
- Grade 10: 697 tested (64% female), 59% passed

These results inform our tailored approach to gender education for each grade level.

International Women's Day 2024 Celebration

Theme: "Empowering Women in the Digital Age: Bridging Gaps, Creating Opportunities"

Events held at three schools with a total of 404 participants:

- 1. Aranh Sakor CFC High School: 140 attendees (41% female)
- 2. Hun Sen Prasat Bakong High School: 135 attendees (70% female)
- 3. Bakong Motwani Junior High School: 129 attendees (71% female)

Activities included tech workshops, panel discussions with female STEM professionals, and a hackathon focused on solving local community issues.

Equitable Resource Distribution

Collaborated with the Outreach team to provide essential study materials:

- 125 backpacks distributed to students in need
- Focus on three schools: Aranh Cuthbert JHS, Hun Sen Prasat Bakong HS, and Bakong Motwani JHS
- 66% of recipients were female students

Gender-Inclusive Learning Spaces

Established a dedicated Gender and Counseling Room at the Education Development Center:

- Installed one bookshelf with 56 curated books
- Topics include women's empowerment, business leadership, legal rights, and inspirational fiction
- Created a safe, comfortable space for reading, counseling, and gender-related discussions

Community Engagement on Child Protection

Conducted an extensive nine-day community dialogue series:

- Theme: "Safeguarding Our Future: Community-wide Child Protection"
- Participants:
 - 12 local authorities (including village chiefs, police, and administrative leaders)
 - 281 community members from 8 villages (84% female)
 - 10 pre-school teachers
 - 193 parents (100% female)
 - 164 children (60% girls)

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CFC Career Preparation Program: Empowering Cambodia's Future Workforce in 2024

Our initiatives focus on blending practical skills with real-world exposure, ensuring students are wellprepared for their future careers or higher education.

Comprehensive Career Readiness Curriculum

At Aranh High School, we've implemented an advanced career preparation curriculum, reaching:

- 709 students (325 female)
- Grades 10-12
- 7 intensive sessions per student

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CFC Food for Thought Program: Nourishing Bodies and Minds in 2024

Our initiatives focus on sustainable feeding practices, hygiene, and educational opportunities through our meal programs.

Year-Round Community Support

Even during school vacations, FFT maintained its commitment to community nutrition:

- 1,202 students and community members received porridge during the break
- Implemented a take-home model to ensure continuous access to nutrition

BUILDING STRONG & SUSTAINABLE EDUCATION SYSTEMS (FOOD FOR THOUGHT AND EARLY-CHILDHOOD EDUCATION)

Ensuring the protection of children's rights, as enshrined in the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, is the first consideration in all engagements.

Food for Thought (FFT) provides two nutritious meals daily to thousands of CFC students – over 2 million meals annually. These meals are a reason to attend school and a primary contributor to their ability to focus in the classroom. According to our students, parents, and communities, FFT ranks as CFC's most crucial program.

In a country where 42% of children's growth (USAID) is stunted due to malnutrition and in a region with the highest infant mortality in the country, this program keeps CFC's young students healthy and learning.

The main component of the meals are Manna-Packs of fortified rice and protein contributed by Feed My Starving Children (FMSC). CFC adds fish sauce with vitamins and local vegetables. Chefs (often parents or grandparents of our students) prepare food beginning at dawn and serve students breakfast and lunch every day.

CFC is a national leader in early learning and programs, thanks to our preschools and kindergarten programs. Our preschools lead the country in best practices and early enrollment, making it more likely that young students will stay in school, achieve, and graduate. Designed to support caregivers and teach them skills they were not able to learn from their own families due to genocide and poverty, CFC provides children and families with resources for health, nutrition, early skills-building, and more.

The results are outstanding: CFC preschool programs are likelier to use basic first aid techniques and local initiatives such as Vitamin A support and deworming, and 93% of CFC preschool parents enroll their children by age 5, compared to only 33% nationwide.



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\$300 USD/\$402 SGD sends a child to school for one year, including food, and all supplies.

Since 2001, Caring for Cambodia has **supported a generation of engaged educators, and community members, and families, helping to prepare students to thrive today and shape tomorrow's world**. CFC's work in K-12 schools and the community provides children and youth the preparation, the platform, and the opportunities to understand all the world has to offer, eat healthy, and learn in a safe environment.
