
11,088 students across all of

In Kvaeo clusters, **134 classroom teachers** were trained, with **40 teachers** specifically trained as technical grade leaders and mentor teachers





Our school network has grown to **36 schools**, including the successful completion of a three-year support for the **15 schools** in the Kvao cluster





Over **2 million** nutritious meals are provided each year, helping students stay focused, engaged, and ready to learn in the classroom.

Since six months old, Rithy Lymenghong has been nourished through our **Food For Thought Program**. Now six and thriving, he represents the lifelong impact of consistent healthy meals.
